History (*cont'd*)

- Adventure into computerisation by late University Librarian – Mr. B. U. Nwafor in the mid-80s
- Acquisition of The Information Navigator for Libraries (TINLIB) in the early 1990s to process books acquired through the facility of the World Bank for Nigerian universities
- Experimentation with CDIS/ISIS
- Design and creation of University and Library web page in the late 1990s



History (*cont'd*)

- Digitisation of catalogue of Documents and Special Collections in early 2000
- Arrival of egranary Digital Library, c2000
- Acquisition of Bibliofile, later Bibliofile Integrated Technical Services (ITS) for Windows in 2001
- Installation of solar – inverter back up system for the library in 2001



History (*cont'd*)

- Intervention of Carnegie Corporation of New York, 2003
 - Retrospective conversion of catalogue
 - Library Management System (virtua)
 - Training of library staff on digitisation, 2004 – 2010
- Creation of Nigeria's 1st Institutional Repository, 2009
